



British Wool – Sale Report

BW101 – 14th July 2020



Key Points

BW101 saw good interest across a broad range of wool types with British Wool selling a total of 827 tonnes and pricing generally holding firm. This is consistent with the weight we have sold in the last two sales. Interest was strongest in the Medium types.

- Total weight offered 1.481m kg Total weight sold 0.827m kg
- Clearance 55.8%
- Average clean price £0.806 / kg Average greasy price £0.543 / kg

The clearances by wool type were as follows;

- Fine wool 68%,
- Medium wool 91%,
- Mule wool 37%,
- Hill wool 33%,
- Mountain wool 37%,
- Lamb 25%.

Price movements for key wool types

Prices where comparable to BW98;

Fine: Southdown Charollais – fully 2% dearer. Hoggs No1 – buyers favour. Hogg No2 – 4% dearer. Ewes No1 – firm. Ewes No2 – up to 2% cheaper.

Romney: Buyers favour where sold.

Medium: Hoggs No1 – buyers favour. Ewes No1 – up to 2% cheaper. Ewes No2 – firm. Ewes Discoloured – sellers favour to 3% dearer.

Mules: Hoggs No1 – unsold. Hoggs No2 – firm. Ewes No1 – fully firm. Ewes No2 – firm. Cott grades – buyers favour where sold.

Cheviots: Firm to buyers favour where sold.

Hill: Fine – fully firm. Medium – unsold.

Swaledale: Unsold.

Blackface: Medium No1 and fine – unsold. No2 – firm. Cott grades – buyers favour.

Welsh: No1 and No2 – buyers favour.

Lamb: All grades where sold were at a similar level to the previous sale.
