



# British Wool – Sale Report

## BW105 – 8<sup>th</sup> September 2020



### Key Points

BW105 saw prices for British Wool hold firm or move dearer for most types and a total sale volume of 1,330 tonnes. 962 tonnes was old season wool and a further 368 tonnes was new season wool.

- Total weight offered 1.771m kg      Total weight sold 1.330m kg
- Clearance 75%
- Average clean price £0.734 / kg      Average greasy price £0.50 / kg

The clearances by wool type were as follows;

- Fine wool 86%,
- Medium wool 83%,
- Mule wool 67%,
- Hill wool 72%,
- Mountain wool 63%,
- Lamb 84%.

### Price movements for key wool types

Prices where comparable to BW104;

Fine: Hoggs No2 – buyers favour. Ewes No1 – sellers favour. Ewes No2 – up to 5% dearer.

Romney: All grades firm where comparable.

Medium: Hoggs No1 – buyers favour. Hoggs No2 – up to 3% dearer. Ewes No1 & No2 – firm. Ewes Discoloured – sellers favour where comparable.

Mules: All grades firm except Cott grades which were buyers favour where comparable.

Cheviots: Hoggs No1 & No2 – buyers favour. Ewes No1 – fully 2% dearer. Ewes No2 – fully firm. Cross grades – buyers favour.

Hill: Fine – fully firm. Medium – up to 2% dearer.

Swaledale: No1 – firm. Grey – sellers favour.

Blackface: All grades firm where comparable.

Welsh: All grades firm.

Lamb: All grades fully firm where sold.
