



British Wool – Sale Report

BW107 – 6th October 2020



Key Points

BW107 saw competitive bidding with prices generally typically 3% dearer, and a total sale volume of 1,619 tonnes. Of the wool sold 669 tonnes was old season wool and a further 951 tonnes was new season wool.

- Clearance 94%
- Average clean price £0.759 / kg Average greasy price £0.516 / kg

The clearances by wool type were as follows;

- Fine wool 96%,
- Medium wool 94%,
- Mule wool 91%,

- Mountain wool 94%,
- Lamb 100%.

Price movements for key wool types

Prices where comparable to BW106;

Fine: Southdown and Charollais Ewes – 1% dearer. Hoggs No1 – 2% dearer. Hoggs No2 – fully 6% dearer. Ewes No1 – 3% dearer. Ewes No2 – 2.5% dearer.

Romney: Ewes No1 – 3% dearer. Ewes No2 – fully 5% dearer.

Medium: Hoggs No1 – fully 4% dearer. Hoggs No2 – fully 7.5% dearer. Ewes No1 – 3% dearer. Ewes No2 – fully 1% dearer. Ewes Discoloured – firm. Lt Grey – fully firm.

Mules: Hoggs No1 & No2 – firm to 5% dearer. Ewes No1 – firm. Ewes No2 – 1% dearer. All Cott grades – firm to 3% dearer. Lt Grey – sellers favour.

Cheviots: Hoggs No2 – fully 5% dearer. Ewes No1 – firm. Ewes No2 – 1% dearer. Cross grades – up to 5% dearer.

Hill: Fine and Medium No2 – 4% dearer.

Swaledale: All grades up to 10% dearer.

Blackface: Fine and Medium No1 – firm. No2 – fully 5% dearer. Cottis – firm.

Welsh: No1 – 2% dearer. No2 – fully firm. Coloured Kempy – 4% dearer.

Lamb: All grades that were offered sold at higher levels where comparable.
