The British Wool index fell by 2.7% sale on sale to £1.279 / kg clean.

Average clean price £1.264 / kg Average greasy price £0.842 / kg

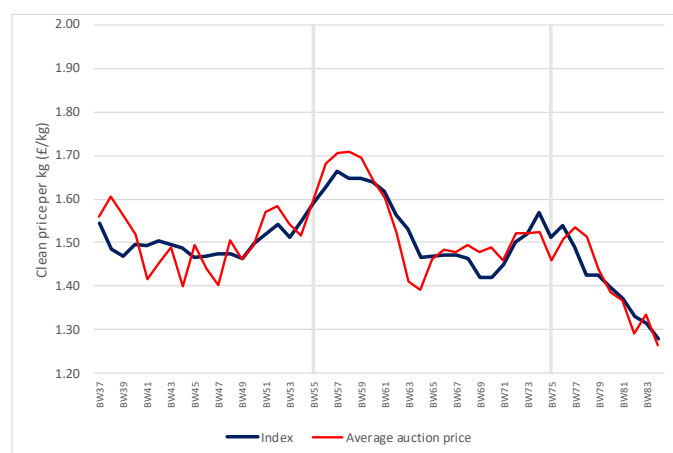
Commentary

BW84 saw selective bidding with good interest on the combing types.

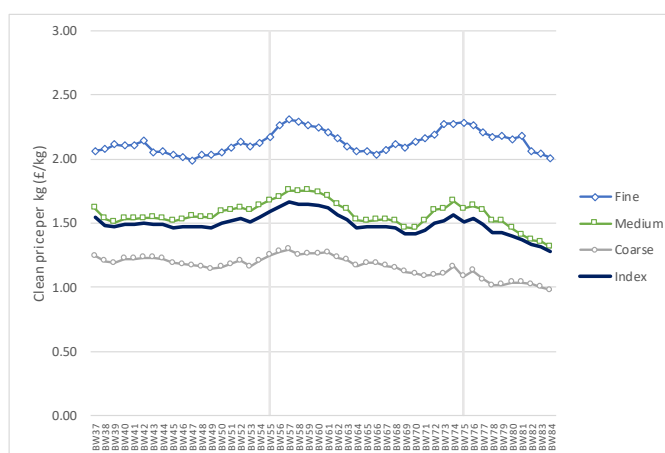
Overall 1.089 million kg of the 1.661 million kg offered sold, a clearance of 65.6%.

The clearances by wool type were as follows; Fine wool 82%, Medium wool 82%, Crossbred wool 47%, Hill wool 42%, and Mountain wool 76%.

Price movements for key wool types

Fine: Hogs – Buyers favour. Ewes No1 – 1% cheaper. Ewes No2 – Fully firm. Lt Grey – 2.5% cheaper.

Medium: Hogs No2 – Fully firm. Ewes No1 – 1.5% cheaper. Ewes No2 – 1% Cheaper. Naturally Discoloured – up to 5% cheaper. Lt Grey – 1.5% Cheaper.

Mules: Hogs – Buyers favour. Ewes No1 – 1.5% cheaper. Ewes No2 – 1% cheaper. Cott grades – Buyers favour to 1.5% cheaper. Lt Grey – Buyers favour.

Cheviots: Hogs – up to 1.5% cheaper. Ewes No2 – 1.5% cheaper.

Radnors: Fine – Unsold. Mediums – were sold at a slightly lower level than when last sold.

Welsh: Firm.

Blackface: No1 & No2 – Firm to Buyers favour. Fine No1 – 1.5% cheaper. Cottis – where sold up to 3% cheaper.

Swaledale: No1 – were sold at a slightly higher level than the last price achieved. No2 – were sold at a slightly lower level than the last price achieved. Grey – Firm.
