



# British Wool – Sale Report

## BW98 – 30<sup>th</sup> June 2020



### Key Points

BW98 saw interest across a broad range of wool types with British Wool selling a total of 830 tonnes. This is slightly above the weight we cleared in BW97 two weeks ago. Interest was strongest in the Fine and Medium types.

- Total weight offered 1.629m kg      Total weight sold 0.831m kg
- Clearance 51.0%
- Average clean price £0.770 / kg      Average greasy price £0.508 / kg

The clearances by wool type were as follows;

- Fine wool 76%,
- Medium wool 57%,
- Mule wool 33%,
- Hill wool 37%,
- Mountain wool 33%,
- Lamb 77%.

### Price movements for key wool types

Prices where comparable to BW97;

Fine: Southdown Charollais Ewes – fully firm. Hoggs No2 – up to 3% cheaper on a poorer selection. Ewes No1 – 2.5% cheaper. Ewes No2 – up to 3% cheaper on a poorer selection.

Romney: Ewes No1 – 2.5% cheaper. Ewes No2 – fully 7.5% dearer on a better selection.

Medium: Hoggs No2 – fully 7.5% dearer on a better selection. Ewes No1 – fully 2% dearer where sold. Ewes No2 – up to 2.5% cheaper on a poorer selection. Ewes Discoloured – fully 5% cheaper on a poorer selection. Lt Grey – sellers favour.

Mules: Ewes No1 – up to 2% cheaper where sold. Ewes No2 – up to 3% cheaper. Cott grades – fully 3% cheaper. Lt Grey – up to 2% cheaper.

Cheviots: Hoggs No1 – up to 3% cheaper. Cross No1 & No2 – fully 3% cheaper.

Hill: Fine Ewes No2 – fully 3% cheaper. Medium – unsold.

Swaledale: Unsold.

Blackface: Medium No1 – fully firm. No2 – buyers favour. Cott grades – buyers favour.

Welsh: Unsold.

Lamb: All grades where sold were at a similar level to the previous sale.
