



British Wool – Sale Report

BW119 – 30th March 2021



Key Points

BW119 had a 100% clearance with prices generally firm to slightly dearer. The average greasy sale price of 66.3p / kg was in line with the previous sale and the British Wool Index increased by 1.0%.

Price movements for key wool types

Prices where comparable to BW118;

Fine: Hoggs No1 – up to 2.5% cheaper. Hoggs No2 – fully firm. Ewes No1 – fully 2.5% dearer. Ewes No2 – firm. Lt Grey – up to 2.5% dearer.

Romney: All grades fully 2.5% dearer.

Medium: Hoggs No1 – firm. Hoggs No2 – fully firm. Ewes No1 – firm. Ewes No2 – up to 2% dearer. Naturally discoloured – firm. Lt Grey – Buyers favour.

Mules: Hoggs No1 – 5 to 10% dearer. Hoggs No2 – generally 7.5% dearer. Ewes No1 – up to 3.5% dearer. Ewes No2 – firm to 5% dearer. All Cott grades – firm to 3% dearer. Lt Grey – fully firm.

Cheviots: Hoggs No2 – up to 2.5% dearer. Ewes No1 – fully firm. Ewes No2 – fully firm. Cross grades – sellers favour.

Hill: Fine – firm. Medium – Buyers favour.

Swaledale: No1 – fully 5% dearer. Grey – up to 7.5% dearer.

Blackface: Medium No1 – fully 5% dearer. No2 – fully firm. Cotts – fully 10% dearer.

Welsh: No1 – sellers favour. No2 – fully 3.5% dearer. Coloured kempy – fully 2% dearer.

Lamb: Where comparable lamb grades sold at similar to higher level than last time.
